Our communion practice: On Sundays that we have the Lord's Supper, we follow the guidance of the Scriptures and the example of the historic Christian church by practicing close communion. Today's theme: <u>lesus Makes Fishers of Men</u>

The Lord called fishermen to be fishers of men (Luke 5:1–11). The net they would use is the Gospel message. Jesus gave an illustrative lesson of how these fishermen would catch men. He did by attaching his Word to a catch so that the fisherman's boats were filled with fish. So it is that in Baptism you have been drawn into the ship of the Church. Though the nets are breaking and some who hear the Word do not believe, pastors continue to cast the net of the Gospel and the Sacraments, that Christians may abide in the boat of the Church and that we may "be ready to give a <u>defense</u> to everyone who asks a reason for the hope that is in us" (1 Peter 3:8–15).

Apologetic Material and Videos. The word Peter uses for <u>defense</u> in the original language (Greek) is the word from which we get "Apologetic." Apologetics use reasoned arguments to get unbelievers to want to know more about what the Bible says about Jesus. In order to help our members use apologetics the Evangelical Lutheran Synod has a Center for Apologetics and Worldviews. Two samples are provided for you today.
